Please take notes in your book, mark any significant passages and write a quick summary sentence or two after each chapter so that you can find quotes to support your thesis when you are writing it. (You will need at least 12 quotes from your book for the literary analysis, so it saves you TONS of time next year if you annotate as you read.)
